Project Location:

The project is located within the city limits of New Ellenton along the following streets: East Pine St, Shady Ln, Valley Ave, Harlen St, South Boundary Ave, Jackson Ave, Green St, Walker Ave, Williamson Ave, Oak Ridge Rd, and Myrtle St.

Description of the Proposed Project (*include all contemplated actions, regardless of funding source*) [24 CFR 50.12 & 58.32; 40 CFR 1508.25]:

The primary activity of this project will be the demolition of a total of 15 uninhabitable homes within the project area. Previous inspections of these units determined that rehabilitation is not feasible. Title searches will be conducted by the city's attorney prior to demo. Asbestos and air monitoring will be the first activity that will be competitively procured following CDBG guidelines. If any asbestos is discovered in a unit, all guidelines pertaining to proper disposal, such as a landfill facility properly permitted for asbestos disposal, will be followed.

Statement of Purpose and Need for the Proposal (*explain why the project is needed and the expected results*) [40 CFR 1508.9(b)]:

The city of New Ellenton is a rural community in Aiken County with a population of 2,604 residents of which 51 % are Low to Moderate Income. The presence of blighted buildings suppresses economic growth, diminishes property values, and becomes a haven for criminal activity. Crime is a problem in the area. Removing these uninhabitable structures will improve safety, aesthetics, and promote new development.

Existing Conditions and Trends (*describe the existing conditions of the project area and its surroundings, as well as trends likely to continue in the absence of the project*) [24 CFR 58.40(a)]:

The City of New Ellenton is a rural community with a population of 2,604 located within Aiken County, SC. Crime has been a problem in the area, with New Ellenton maintaining a violent crime rate that is above the national average. Dilapidated buildings present health and safety risks, as well as becoming havens for criminal activity. The presence of blighted buildings suppresses economic growth and diminishes property values. This leads to a decrease in tax revenue for the city and has a major community impact. These conditions, if not addressed, will continue to deteriorate and negatively impact the residents.

The Combined Notice of Funding No Significant Impact on the Environment and Notice of Intent to Request Release of Funds will be posted by the City of New Ellenton for an 18-day local public comment period during which time the public may review and comment on the Environmental Review. After the completion of the local public comment period, the Environmental Assessment will then be sent to the State for an additional 15-day comment period. Therefore, the public will be given notice of the project and two comment periods.

This project is not a multiple phase project, and as such, a Cumulative Impact Analysis does not apply.

The only non-action alternative to the proposed project was the rehabilitation of the existing structures. However, the properties were inspected during the application process and the inspector concluded that the structures were uninhabitable as the structures have deteriorated to the point where restoration is not feasible.

No Action Alternative (discuss the benefits and adverse impacts to the human environment of not implementing the preferred alternative) [24 CFR 58.40(e)]:

No action allows the existing poor conditions to worsen. This scenario would likely worsen current health and safety issues, resulting in diminished living conditions for neighborhood residents.

Summary of Findings and Conclusions (discuss whether the review indicated the preferred alternative will have an adverse impact on the environment and how it will impact the end users):

This assessment has determined that demolition of the targeted dilapidated residential units will not have an adverse effect on the environment. This assessment evaluated the physical environment, as well as the socioeconomic environment. In summary, the project will not impact coastal barriers or coastal zones as it is not located in a coastal zone of the state. There will be no impact to clean air, endangered species, farmlands, sole source aquifers, wetlands, wild scenic rivers, historic preservation, nor will the project adversely impact land development, socioeconomic factors, community facilities, or natural features. The project will improve the overall health and safety of the citizens of the town.

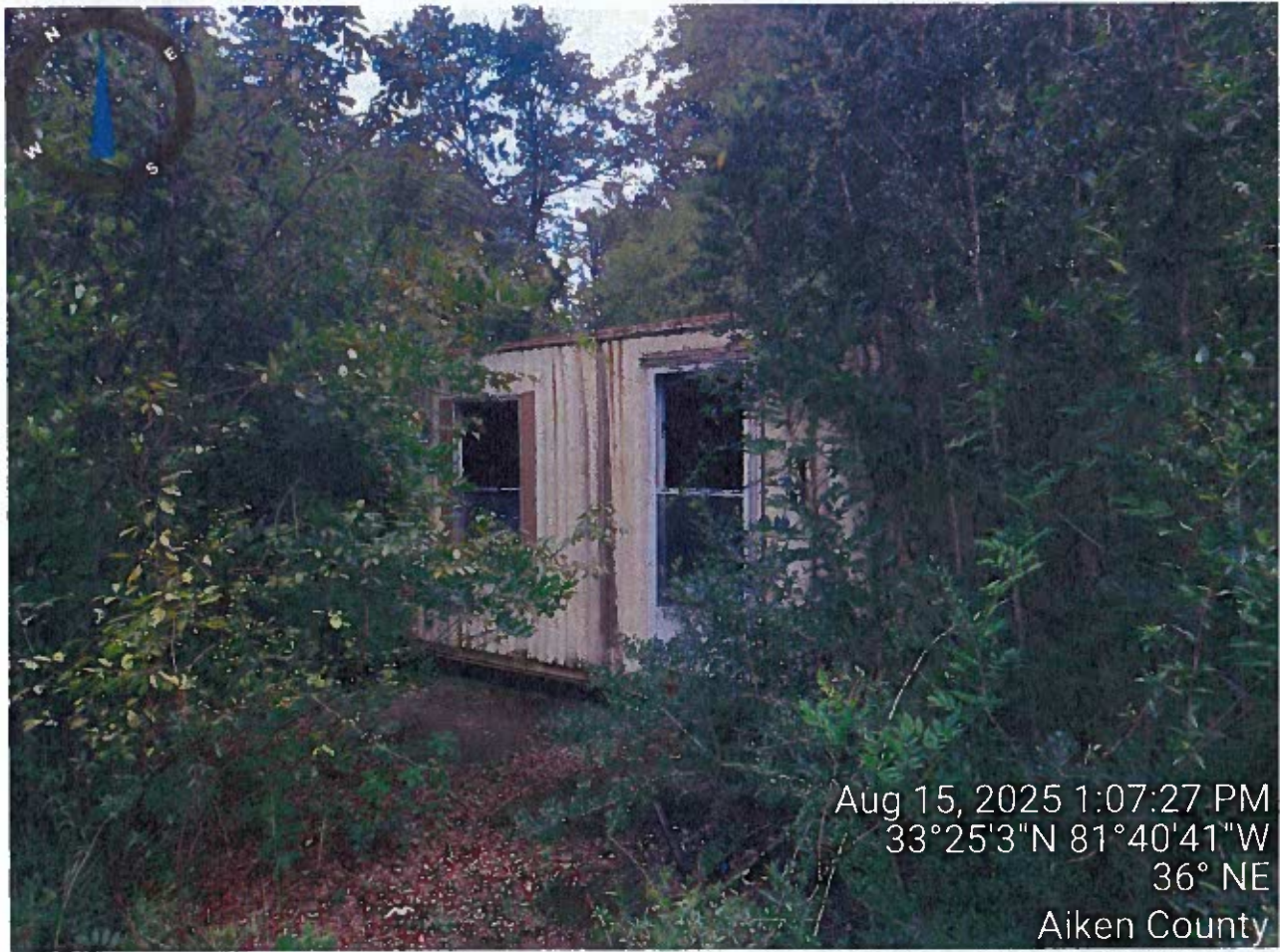

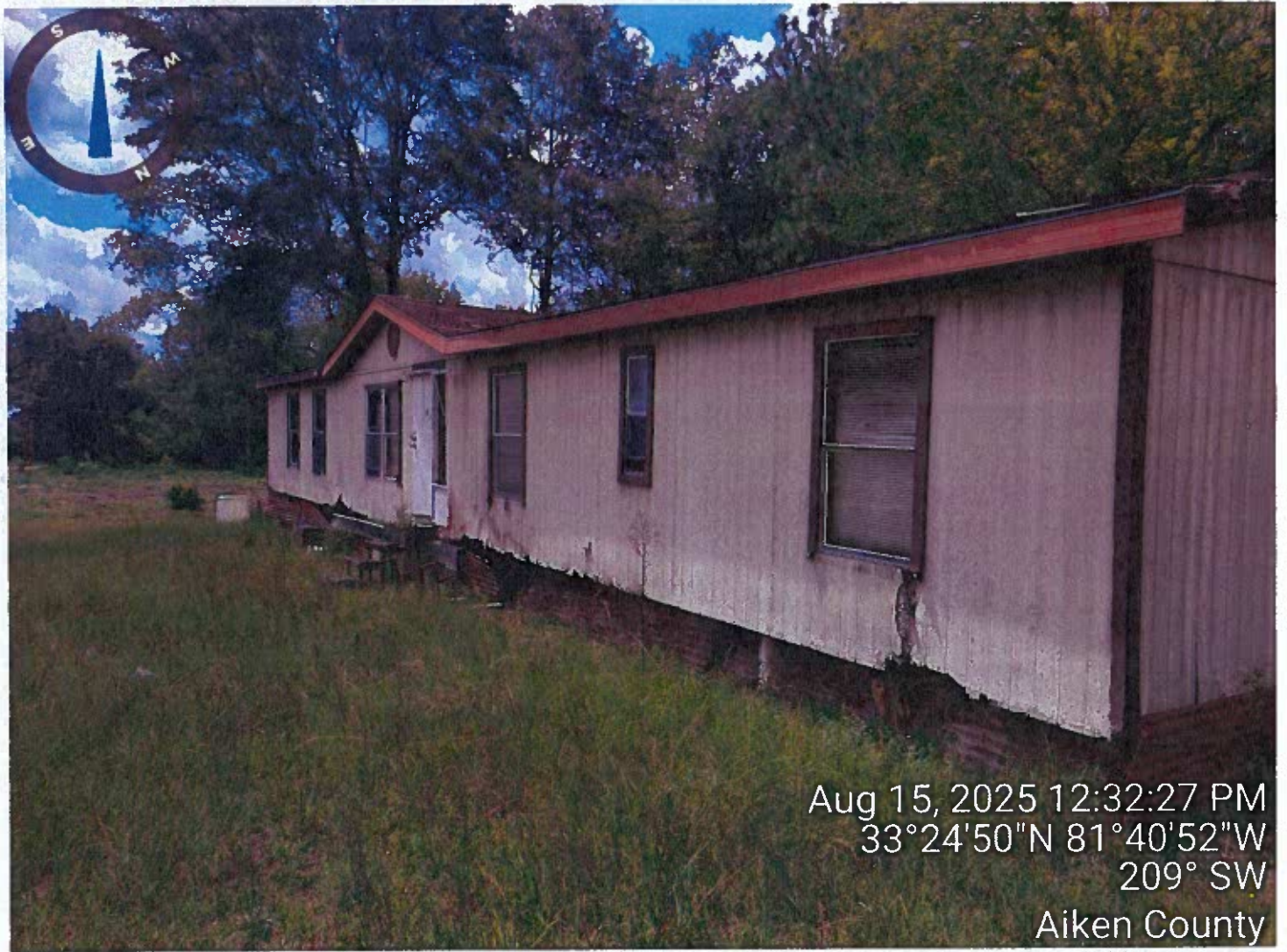

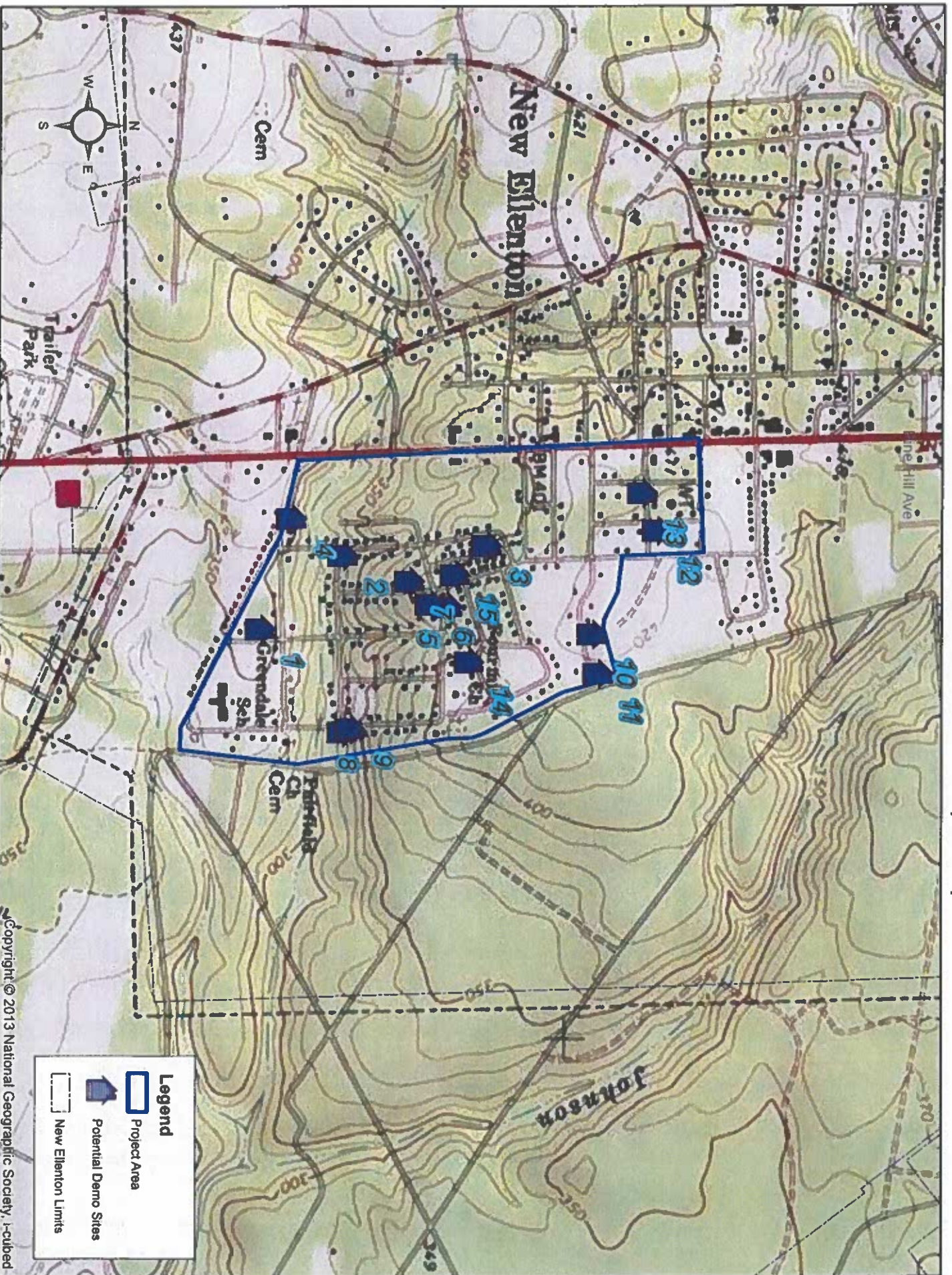

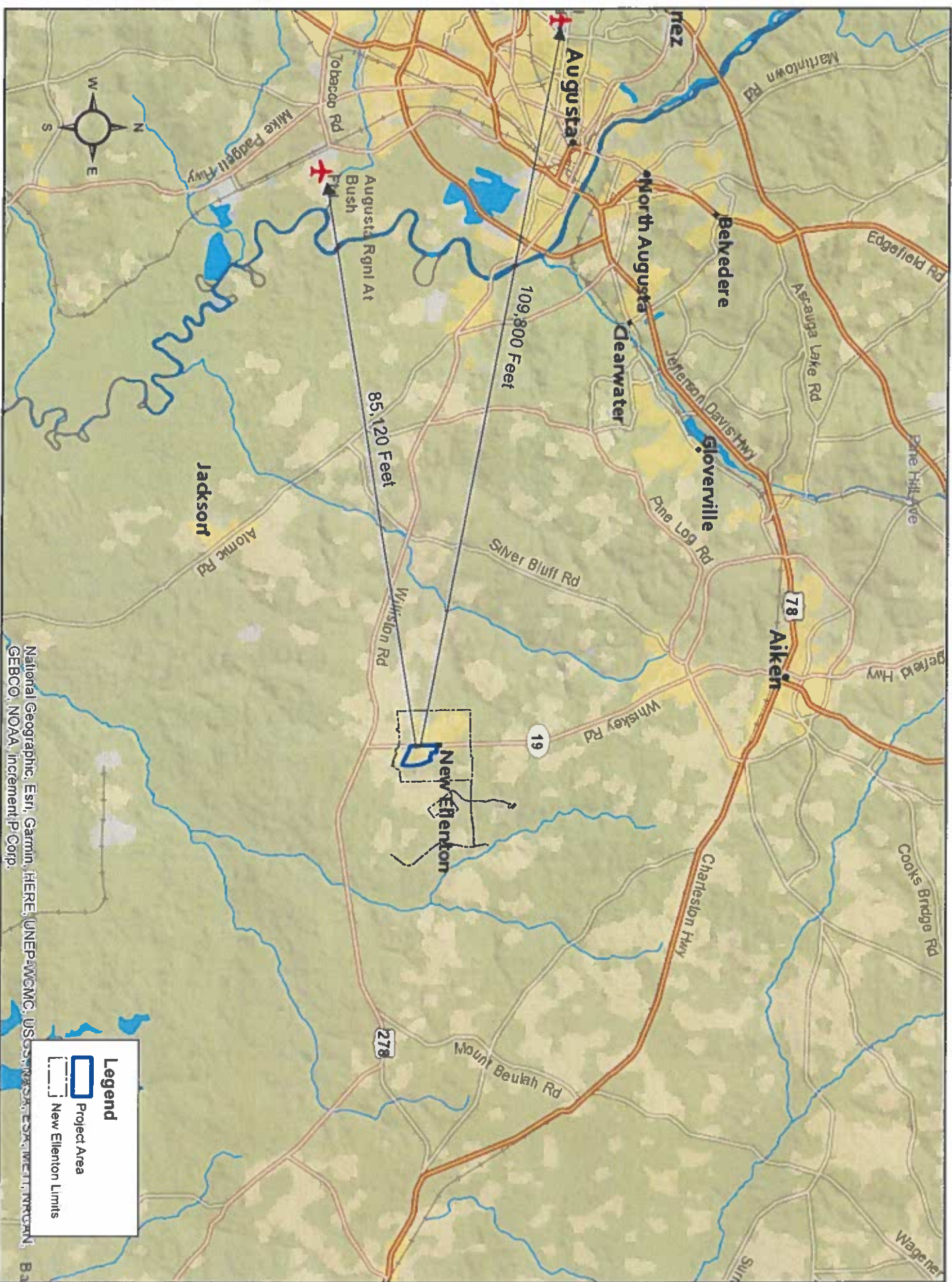

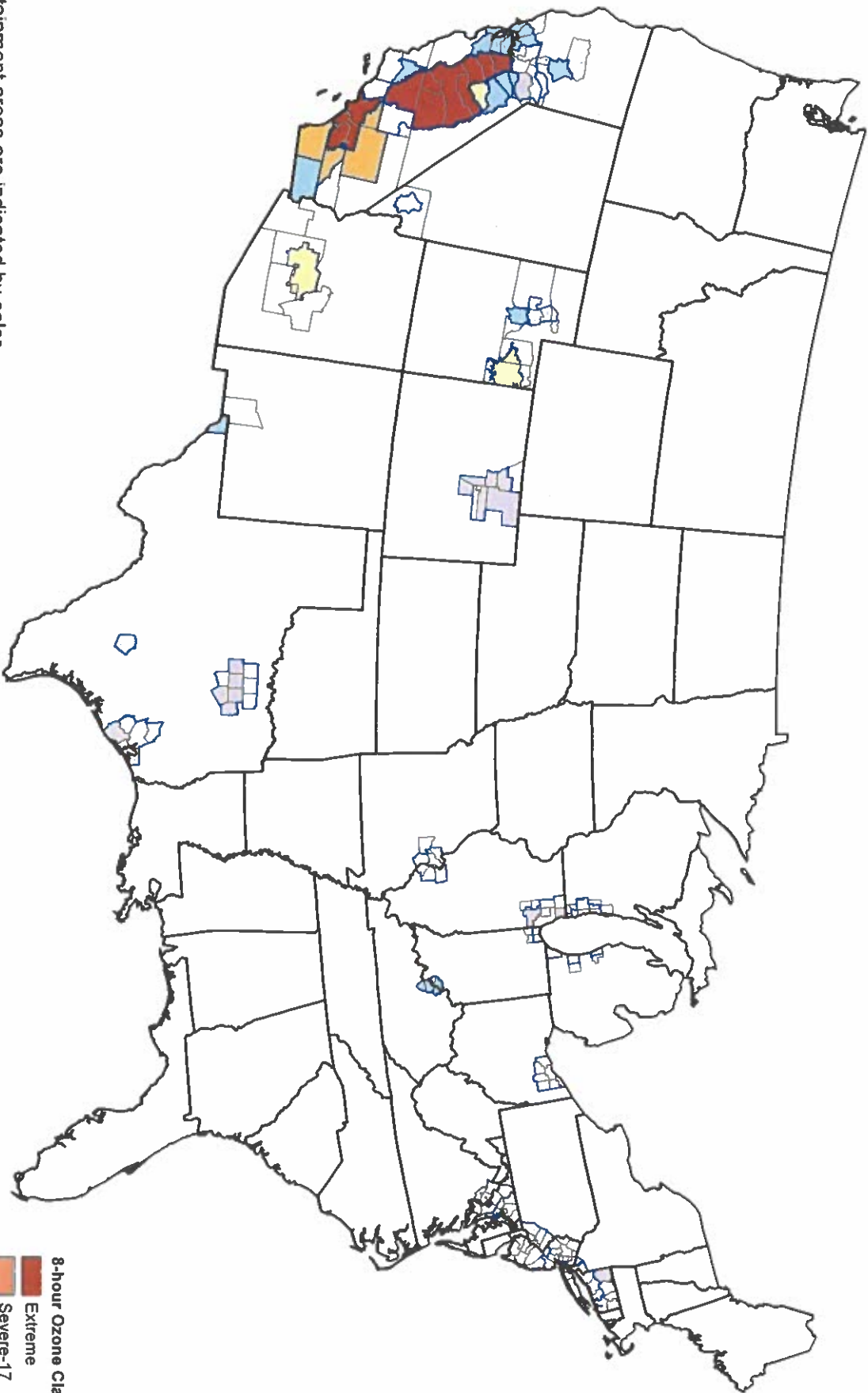
