- \*NEPD encouraging ride-alongs to give better perception of daily Officer activities by public, still would like Council members to participate.
- \*Officer Craig is doing well in her new position at Greendale Elementary, being proactive and addressing ways to ensure the safety of staff and students.
- \*Having mechanical issues with 2019 Tahoe, will be going into shop tomorrow to establish repair options/costs to weigh decisions on what steps to take next. No spare vehicles at this time as a result.
