- 4. **Keyatta Priester-** Allstar, Diversity Director, and Community Relations Director with Aiken Electric Cooperative; came to meeting to ask council to become stakeholders and possibly donate a 4-5,000 square facility for the prospective Christian-based charter school that will identify the gaps/needs of children in the area and provide a secure and caring learning environment; the prospective staff would be community residents, where possible; there will be a need for at least 6 months to begin steps toward child care facility, hopes to move forward within 2 to 3 years to a charter school that will provide opportunity for 70-80 children from ages newborn through 13 years.
