### **COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC:**

\*Chief S. Middleton (Police)- Department is set-up for finger printing and service will be offered to the public for \$10. There have been an influx of calls in the city and department is working hard to solve crimes in the area; working with Sheriff's office. There was active shooter training and at least 20 children helped with the demonstration. The police department worked with fire department to train for any situation. \*Chief referenced the monthly report that will be available at <a href="www.newellentonsc.com">www.newellentonsc.com</a> with approved minutes\*

\*Pastor Debra Creech (Christ Central)-Asked Chief Middleton how long the response time is for alarm system calls. Chief Middleton responded that it varies depending on the dispatch being sent from the alarm system company. Debra stated that she did not receive a call back or confirmation from dispatch from alarm on Saturday. Christ Central completed emergency shelter; there are serious problems that need to be addressed before shelter can open: security; water. The alarm is a pull-down system and there is no water connection. Debra asked if there could be a hydrant test and if someone would come out to show them where the water system is located. Debra, also, asked if someone from Fire and Water departments would assist with establishing procedures that would be available for whomever will be working in the shelter, in the case of emergency, when the fire alarm goes off and that she needs to know where everything starts. Chief Mike Kellems stated that Danny Lowe should be able to answer those questions and beyond the water meter to the building is private property and the Commission of Public Works is not responsible for issues on private property; fire alarm calls go through dispatch center at Aiken County; Commission of Public Works purchases a GPR that may be able to pick up where line starts. Councilmembers: Jason stated that pull cord may be old and not hooked into alarm system; Ricky stated that the first dispatch center was located in the building when the center was a nursing home in the 1970's; Mayor Kim stated that Debra should check into security system with Carver Security in Aiken.

\*Chief Mike Kellems (Fire & Water Commissioner)- June-126 service calls; 24 fire related mutual aid calls. Apparatus bought through Forestry program; working on funding for smaller ticket items. New 250 for truck came last month; 2 new trucks in service. Gave a "pat on the back" for Chief Middleton for service in the town as he reached out to work with the fire department and Kellems can see a different leadership. Chime Bell's traffic light was stated in feasibility report and there was surprise that the need for the light on Chime Bell has precedence over light at Eagle Road. There are plans to re-align traffic on Whiskey Road to Carrol Avenue instead of going down Whiskey Road; there are plans to express concern about the need for a light at Eagle and Whiskey Road. Asked Council to donate a piece of land to be used as storage area for Commission of Public Works \*no fire report available\*

\*Kenny Cook (City Administrator)- There is a consent order; there has been updates to sprinkler system and odor abatement plan; liner replacement is the most expensive to complete. Drain repair needs to be done before replacement; working on funding to get liner replaced. September 12th is the date for application to be completed; funding is needed to tie people into the system and expand to areas toward Aiken; pipelines need to be installed for anyone interested in tapping into system; would expand toward SRS-there are calls of interest in expansion. There will not be anything done until news of grant; will know from RIA by November if city is a grant recipient; contingent plan to take care of issues at sewer plant in the case of not receiving grant. 15% funding is needed as match to grant.

### **COMMENTS FROM MAYOR & COUNCIL**

\*Faye Durham-Bingo night went well; did bingo night 3 times this summer. Food truck nights going well; will be held Friday at 5:30pm to 8:30pm; water slide for the children. There will be a band that plays beach music and it is beach themed. Playground equipment will not be in before October/November. Atomic City Festival-slide; trampoline; rock climbing; pony rides; DJ; band County Road 49 on Friday; Saturday-street dance; free participation for everyone; donations welcomed; cost was almost \$14,000 for events that are planned; T-shirts for sale at City Hall and Beach Blast-\$25 large sizes; \$20 adult sizes; \$15 children sizes; \$5 decals. Voting/Election-Get out and promote yourself; must have correct name on ballot or it will not count. Cynthia Holland, from Election Commission, will register you, but your name will only be a write-in and not printed on ballot.

\*Iason Morgan-County Road 49; Best band in Aiken County and local band member from New Ellenton (Atomic City Festival)

\*Mayor Kim-SRS meeting update: pits project will hire 1800 people; Radcon need 800 people. Infrastructure for sewer system can hold 2 million at 40,000 gallons/day; DHEC letter showed sewer system is not where it needs to be and made it #1 priority to get consent order and expand system to Whiskey Road and to residents that don't have service. Tom Young meeting to look into funding for different projects; there is a need to increase funding; spoke to a lot of people about infrastructure; recreation; better improvements asked for by people; rezoning will help bring in additional funding; everyone on council committed to see what can be done for improvement in town. Eagle Road light project to come into area is going out for bidding in September; knows that is a concern for anyone going down that road. Kendrick Patterson resigned from council seat; Special Election will be write-in only on September 27th from 7am to 7pm. Anyone that has reached out with concerns have been addressed; doing the best to reach out to everyone and does not respond to Facebook because it is personal. Asked that residents reach out via phone, email or telephone for response.

\*Carl Culpepper, III-has seen comments; nobody is trying to hide anything. Not going to jeopardize the city; please, get email and card to reach out about any concerns; will get back about anything as soon as possible. \*Elvira Johnson-Holley-asked residents to call, text and email to reach out if there are concerns.
